
Collective Prayer Worksheet Teacher Guide

“ if My people, who are called by My name, will humble themselves and pray and seek My face and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from heaven, and I will forgive their sin and will heal their land. “

As part of the Washington: A Man of Prayer curriculum, students will be provided an opportunity to follow his example and pray for America. The prayer time will be a guided prayer time made available through the simulcast/webcast. This activity can be completed as a class or as a school. This portion of the simulcast/webcast will be approximately 10 - 15 minutes.

In order to participate, students will need to spend some time prior to the prayer time thinking about what they will pray. They should list their requests in note form on the worksheet. The worksheet can be a class activity or a homework assignment. They will need to bring their completed worksheet to the prayer time.

Instructions for the Webcast:

Divide your students into groups of 4 or 5 students each. (If your school elects to participate as a campus, consider meeting all together in the gym/commons/hallways but stay together as a class. Hearing the prayers of a campus all together is very powerful.) Have students stand or kneel together in their small groups with their worksheet before them. Begin the webcast. They will listen for the prompter to say the designated phrases introducing each prayer category. After they hear that phrase, they may begin praying aloud, quietly, within their group. Each person in the group should have an opportunity to voice their prayer. The prompter on the webcast will also be praying. Allow the webcast to continue to play. After a few minutes, the prompter will give the next phrase introducing the next prayer category. Students should listen for that phrase and then begin the next category as before. Continue until the webcast prompter closes the prayer.
