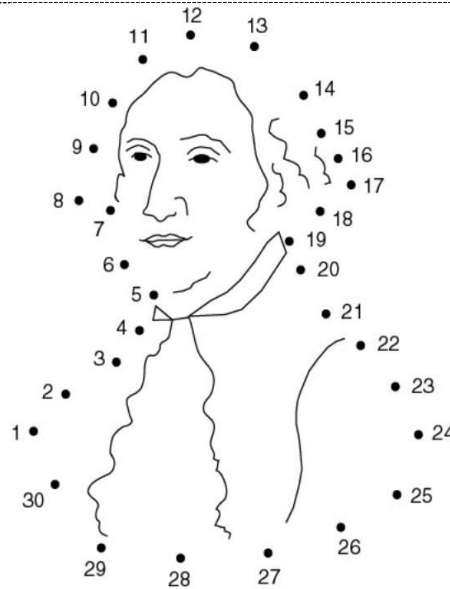

Back and Front Cover. **Fold** in half. Color Washington. Sign your name in the box on the back cover.

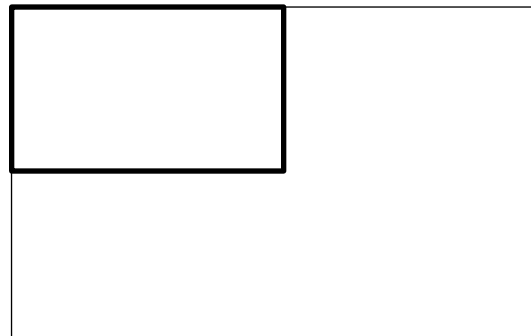
George Washington was at home at Mount Vernon when he learned he had been elected President of the United States.
